

Pilot Project to Promote Organic Consumption in State of Rajasthan (ProOrganic)

Farmers Trainings and Exposure Visits

Synthesis Report

Background

CUTS with financial assistance from Swedish Society for Nature Conservation (SSNC) is implementing a two-year project. The objective of the project is to promote organic consumption in the State of Rajasthan (India) covering six major agriculture potential districts by awareness generation, sensitisation, capacity-building and advocacy activities.

Increased awareness is expected to result in increased consumer demand, which will further push demand for availability and affordability of organic products contributing towards decreasing health hazards of consumers.

The project is expected to result in better informed consumers and farmers about organic consumption and farming and advocating for better policies and enforcement thereof by sensitising policy makers in the State. This will boost organic farming and consumption in the State and in the long run will provide sustainable environment and lifestyle.

Under the project, six, District Level Training Programmes and Exposure Visits for farmer groups were organised. The objective was to motivate farmers to reduce chemical uses in farming by way of several sessions/lectures on organic farming and related issues through subject experts and to showcase some of the successful live demonstration of organic farming for the purpose of practical orientation in the nearby farms.

In all six districts, efforts were made to ensure participation of farmers, especially women farmers representing all blocks of the district. The objective of the orientation was to build capacity of farmers and inspire them to take up organic farming through experience gained from various subject experts and live demos of organic culture. Through the trained farmers, it was further envisaged that they will work as catalyst at local level in order to impart their knowledge gained from orientation and exposure.

Summary of Activities

Six District Level Training Programmes and Exposure Visits were conducted by CUTS. Representation of farmers from each block of the district was ensured. 194 male farmers and only a single female farmer participated in the six events, though only few of them were found to be purely involved in organic agriculture prior to orientation.

These events helped bringing farmers and institutions on a common platform for better coordination in future, which will ultimately help in reaping good results. Healthy debate and discussion over myths about organic culture and financial benefits took place. The events also helped participants to know some of the traditional ways of

organic farming, such as formation of vermin-wash and compost, herbal pesticides/insecticides management, treatment of seeds and soil management etc.

The second day was dedicated to exposure visits in nearby farms, which were managed by local agriculture farmers working exclusively on the pattern of organic farming. The participants of first day were taken in vehicles to visit nearby farm. The farm owners at all the places showcased live demonstration of various traditional systems of organic farming through their experiences and tried to motivate participants for adopting organic farming. Participants visited farm sites and saw the convergence, which motivated them to adopt organic farming and consumption. Queries from the workshop were clarified in practical.

District level Farmer's trainings and Exposure Visits were organised by CUTS in partnership with district project partners. Around 50 participants from each district representing every sub-district (block) participated in the activity. Target beneficiary of activities were only farmers from selected *panchayats* from six project districts. Special efforts were made to ensure female participation but due to local circumstances, only 44 percent female participation was secured.

Training and Exposure Visit

Farmers Training and Exposure visit both are different activities under the project but these were conducted back to back in each district. The main reason was to ensure that the same group of participants, who attended one-day orientation on organic farming, should also get the practical exposure for better understanding, so that they are in position to actually engage in organic farming. The other reason was to save the organising and other costs to maximise the expenditure outcomes.

Kota

On August 11-12, 2016 a Farmer Training and Visit programme was organised by Ram Krishna Mission Sansthan in Jan Shikshan Sansthan, Kota.

Training (September 23, 2016)

The training programme was attended by approximately 60 people among them 5 were women participants. Dr. I N Gupta was Chief Guest of the programme. In introduction, Yudhister Chansi Chairmen of ram Krishna Mission Sansthan welcomed all the participants.



The resource persons in the programme were Dr L K Dadhich (Environmental Biologist), Dr M K Goyal, (Senior Scientist KVK, Kota) Rajeev Malhotra (Director, Jan Shikshan Sansthan) and Dr I N Gupta (Director Extension, Agriculture University Kota). Deepak Saxena (Assistant Director) and Rajdeep Pareek (Project Officer) from CUTS attended the programme.

Rajdeep Pareek briefed all participants about the Pro-Organic project and its scope. He said that with the help of SSNC, this project is working in six districts of Rajasthan since past three years. A positive outcome of this project is that currently the area under organic farming in Rajasthan has enhanced up to 1,55,020 hectores in year 2015-16. He convinced the participants that by 2020, efforts will be to make Rajasthan total organic state.

Technical Session

Dr. Gupta interacted with people about careless activities of the farmers in the field. He told that in Kota farmer use excessive quantity of water in the fields, they burnt the fields after harvesting, and more seed rate of crops in their fields. Conservation of water is necessary for farmers. They can use sprinkler system, drip irrigation system in the field to reduce water loss in their fields. He also focused on excessive use of chemical fertilisers and pesticides in the fields by farmers and hazardous effects of this chemical farming. He informed the people that on consuming oxytocin used vegetables, infertility increases in men and women both.

Rajiv Malhotra interacted with people about employment programmes running by Jan Shikshan Sansthan. He urged people to get involved in their training programmes related to rural employment and select their profession also. He added that some agriculture related training programmes are also being run by the organisation and all farmers can acquire technical expertise by attending these programmes.

Dr L K Dhadhich interacted with people about environmental pollution due to high use of chemical fertilisers and pesticides. He told people that soil become hard and unfertile by use of chemical fertilisers. Chemical fertilisers and pesticides are polluting our soil, air and water and these three things cannot make in laboratory by any scientist of the world. He shared the benefits of organic farming with the people about. He stated that there is no environment pollution with organic farming and farmers can get high prices from their organic products in the market.

In between the session a movie related to organic farming was shown to all the participants. Movie was on the hazardous effects of chemical farming and benefits of organic farming.

Dr M K Goyal interacted with people and elucidated them about organic farming practices and benefits of organic farming. He urged people to adopt natural techniques for nutrient management, pest and disease control in their farms to reduce cost of cultivation.

The programme ended with a vote of thanks to all participants and announcement of participants and venue for the following day's visit.



Exposure Visit (September 24, 2016)

Around 30 participants were taken to organic farm of Narendra Malav, a farmer with a progressive outlook. The transportation arrangement to take all the farmers to the farms was done by CUTS. While in field Narendra Malav asked the participants to grow organic crops and get quality yield

The participants visited vermin-composting unit, solar plant, storage structure for onion and garlic. Narendra Malav also has a unit of beekeeping. They also visited the entire organic farm and acquired technical information about different units. Malav presents a brief overview and benefits of these technologies to the participants. This visit inspired the participants to adopt organic farming. The event ended with a vote of thanks by Yudhister Chansi to Malav and the participants.

Udaipur

Farmer Training and Visit Programme

On October 04-05, 2016 a Farmer Training and Visit programme was organised by Manyata Sansthan in Astha Campus, Bedla Road Udaipur.

Training (October 4, 2016)

The training programme was attended by approximately 57 people among them 35 were women participants. Deepak Saxena (Assistant Director) and Rajdeep Pareek (Project Officer) from CUTS attended the programme. Suprateek Dewal, Chairman of Manyata Sansthan welcomed all the participants. The resource persons in the programme were Pannalal (Secretary General of Manyata Sansthan), Moti Singh Rathor

(Scientist, KVK Udaipur), Dr Anand Singh Jodha (PC KVK, Udaipur), and Girwar Singh Ranawat (Agricultural Officer Udaipur).

Deepak Saxena and Rajdeep Pareek interacted with all participants and discussed about the progress of the ProOrganic project and its scope. Deepak Saxena briefed that with the help of SSNC, this project is being implemented in six districts of Rajasthan since past three years. He also stated that climatic conditions and soil of Udaipur district are favorable for organic farming. Thus, every farmer can be benefitted by adopting organic farming.



Technical Session

Panna Lal interacted with people about careless activities of the farmers in the fields. He said that in Udaipur, farmers are using fertilisers and chemicals near lake area and water of lake is polluting by these chemicals. He also warned against excessive use of chemical fertilisers and pesticides in the fields by farmers and hazardous effects of this chemical farming. He told people that use of jeewamrit, herbal spray, neem oil spray will not pollute our fields and lake water.

Moti Singh Rathor interacted with people about importance of animal husbandry in organic farming. He said that animal husbandry is the important component of organic farming. In organic farming, we can use FYM, Poultry yard manure, to improve soil health. We can get an additional income by selling of milk and milk products. He told to people about benefits of organic farming.

In between the session a movie related to organic farming was shown to all the participants. Movie was on the hazardous effects of chemical farming and benefits of organic farming.

Dr Anand Singh Jodha interacted with people about organic farming practices and benefits of organic farming. He urged the people to adopt natural techniques for nutrient management, pest and disease control methods in fruits and vegetables. He told that by using a module of kitchen garden, one can produce nutritious fruits and vegetables in the year for a six-member family in only 50 meter square area.

Girwar Singh Ranawat interacted with people about different government schemes related to organic farming in the state of Rajasthan. He told about Pravasi Kaushal Vikas Yojna (PKVY), Rastriya Krishi Vikas Yojna (RKVY), and Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MNREGA) Yojana.

The programme ended with a vote of thanks given to the participants and announcement of participants and place for the visit to be conducted the following day.

Exposure Visit (October 5, 2016)

Nearly 30 participants visited vermi-composting unit in Astha campus. Panna Lal stated that for establishing unit shady area and humidity is required. Young farmers can adopt these techniques and can become a good entrepreneur.



After that all the participants visited dairy farm of KVK Udaipur where they were told about scientific management of dairy farm. Dr Bhatnagar told about breed improvement programme of buffalo as well as cow. He conveyed about balance ration and use of *azolla* in animal diet.

Dr Ragini Ranawat interacted with all participants regarding fruits and vegetables production by organic farming. The programme ended with a vote of thanks to the participants by Mukesh Paliwal.

Chittorgarh

On October 06-07, 2016 a Farmer's Training and Visit Programme was organised by CHD Chittorgarh in Kisan Bhavan in Chittorgarh.

Training (October 06, 2016)

The training programme was attended by approximately 62 people among them 31 were women participants. Deepak Saxena (Assistant Director) and Rajdeep Pareek (Project Officer) from CUTS attended the programme. Raja Ram Sukhwai (Manager RSSCL Chittorgarh) and Dr O P Sharma (KVK Chittorgarh) were key resource persons in the training. Gauhar Mahmood, Centre Coordinator, CUTS CHD welcomed the participants and provided an insight into the project activities and its objective. He focused on the need of organic farming.

Deepak Saxena interacted with all participants about the Pro-Organic project and its area. He said that with the help of SSNC, this project is working in six districts of Rajasthan since past three years. He added that excessive use of chemical fertilisers and pesticides damages food grains and increases the probability of diseases in human beings and animals.



Technical Session

Raja Ram interacted with people about careless activities of the farmers in the field. He mentioned that currently production is more than the requirement to fulfill the food requirement of the population but by excessive use of chemical fertilisers and pesticides the quality of food grains and soil has degraded. He advised people to adopt organic farming techniques like vermi-composting, jeewamrit and herbal spray to enhance quality of their products.

Dr O P Sharma interacted with people about important farming practices in organic farming. He informed farmers about deep summer plugging, use of bio fertilisers,

pheromone traps, light traps and etc. He said that use of these techniques will reduce the cost of cultivation and increase benefit in agriculture. He indicated that by using organic farming expenditure on health of family members can be reduced as organic products contain lesser chemicals with no side effects.

In between the session a movie related to organic farming was shown to all the participants. Movie was on the hazardous effects of chemical farming and benefits of organic farming.

Rajdeep Pareek interacted with people about organic farming practices and benefits of organic farming. He shared some natural techniques to make herbal spray, jeewamrit and vermi-composting. He recommended people to adopt natural techniques for Nutrient management, pest and disease control methods. He also conveyed information related to different government schemes related to organic farming in the state of Rajasthan.

The programme successfully ended with a vote of thanks to the participants and announcement of names of participants and venue for the visit for the following day.

Exposure Visit (October 7, 2016)

About 45 participants visited organic farm of Nandlal Dhakad. Here the participants visited organic orchard of custard apple, guava, and turmeric and pan crop in the green house. Dhakad told people about organic farming of these crops and importance of Pan Crop.



All the participants also visited solar plant unit, vermi-composting unit, bio gas unit, and the dairy farms. Dhakad encouraged people to make jeewamrit, herbal spray, vermin-composting etc.

Furthermore, an open session was also organised for the participants to know about their viewpoint regarding organic farming. The participants assured to turn their fields organic at least for their family. The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks by Madan Lal Keer to the participants for attending the programme.

Pratapgarh

On 09-10 November 2016 a Farmer's Training and Visit Programme was organised by CHD Chittorgarh in Hotel Divyam Garden.

Training (November 09, 2016)

The training programme was attended by approximately 50 people comprising 10 women participants. Deepak Saxena (Assistant Director) and Rajdeep Pareek (Project Officer) from CUTS attended the programme. Dr. Yogesh Kannoja, Dr B.L Badhala (Scientist KVK) and Krishan Kumar (Deputy Director, Department of Agriculture, Pratapgarh) were key resource persons.

All the participants interacted with each other discussing hazardous effects of chemical farming and benefits of organic farming. They also shared about various government schemes to promote organic farming in the State of Rajasthan. Rajdeep Pareek and Deepak Saxena mentioned about the project activities and some local techniques to reduce cost of cultivation in agriculture.



Deepak Saxena interacted with all participants speaking about the Pro-Organic project and its scope in the State. He stated that with the help of SSNC, the project is working in six districts of Rajasthan since past three years. He told that excessive use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides spoiled our food grains and increased no. of disease in human and animals.

Exposure Visit (November 10, 2016)

On the following day, all participants were taken to KVK Chittorgarh. Around 35 people participated in the programme of which 19 were women. It was the first time when the female participation exceeded the male participation. In the farms, people were shown orchard of custard apple, drip irrigation and making of jeewamrit, herbal spray and other organic pesticides.

Further, an open session was organised for all the participants to know their views on organic farming. All the participants assured to turn their fields organic for the sake of their families. Lastly, a vote of thanks was given by Madan Lal Keer to the participants for attending the training programme.



Dausa

On December 23-24, 2016 a Farmers' Training and Visit Programme was organised by Hanuman *Gram Samiti* in Dausa at Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK).

Training (December 23, 2016)

The training programme was attended by approximately 50 people, among them 25 were women participants. Anand Sharma, incharge of KVK Dausa was Chief Guest of the programme. The Project Director of Hanuman *Garm Samiti* Omprakash Pareek started the programme by giving a welcome speech to the farmers and trainers.

The key resource persons in the programme were B L Jat, senior scientist at KVK Dausa. Deepak Saxena (Assistant Director), Rajdeep Pareek (Project Officer), Nimisha Gaur (Project Officer) from CUTS attended the programme.

After welcome speech, an insight into organic farming was provided by Deepak Saxena. He first introduced about the organic scheme that was initiated in October 2013 in six districts of Rajasthan. He further explained its objectives, and how to achieve these objectives and encounter the coming challenges.

Technical Session

Anand Sharma, incharge of KVK Dausa, threw light on the need of organic farming in contemporary time, soil management importance and ways to do, problem in organic farming and how to overcome those. He told that the need of any particular thing is determined by the society and time period. So, when it was the need to increase production during 90s we preferred using chemicals, but today we need to protect our health and land resources that have deteriorated due to the use of chemicals, we need to go for organic farming. He told that how second green revolution can be brought by improving soil management.

Lastly, training was given by B L Jat, Senior Scientist at KVK Dausa. He highlighted the negative effects of the chemical that are used in farming in modern time, soil health card scheme, proper ways of taking sample of soil and water and Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yozna. He stated that the excess of the chemicals as fertilizers or weedicides used by the farmers in fields are not used by the crop fully. But, this excess of urea, as fertilizer converts into ammonia and nitrous oxide that causes global warming. This also led to decrease in the food grain quantity. To measure the amount of fertilizers that should be used government enacted soil health card scheme.

Rajdeep Pareek interacted with people about organic farming practices and benefits of organic farming. He shared some natural techniques to make Herbal spray, jeewamrit and vermi-composting. He told people to adopt natural techniques for Nutrient management, pest and disease control. He interacted with people about different government schemes related to organic farming in the state of Rajasthan.

The programme concluded with a vote of thanks to all participants and announcement of participants and venue of visit on the following day.

Exposure Visit (December 24, 2016)

Nearly 30 participants were taken to Sabri organic farm at Sawai Madhopur, where they visited 2.5 hectare of organic Aanwala garden, 200 meter vermin compost unit and a dairy of 250 cows. The participants were introduced about the chilling process of milk. After that the participants visited KVK, Sawai Madhopur.

They visited the experimental plots of wheat, vermi-composting unit, solar plant, Storage structure for Onion and Garlic. Om Prakash briefly told about all the technologies and benefits to the participants. This visit gave encouragement to all the

participants to adopt organic farming. The event ended with a vote of thanks by Om Prakash Pareek to all the participants.



Jaipur

On January 05-06, 2017 a Farmer's Training and Visit programme was organised by CUTS CART in Jaipur District at, State Institute of Agriculture Management, Durgapura.

Training (January 05, 2017)

The training programme was attended by approximately 50 people out of which 25 were women. V S Yadav, Professor and Head, Horticulture Department, Durgapura Agriculture farm was the Chief Guest of the programme. Rajdeep Pareek, Project Officer, CUTS CART began the programme by welcoming all the farmers and trainers.

The key resource persons of the programme were Dr B D Yadav, Professor, Horticulture, Dr S Mukherji, Professor, Horticulture; Amit Sharma, Agriculture Expert, Kisan Call Centre. Deepak Saxena (Assistant Director), Dharmendra Chaturvedi (Programme Officer), Rajdeep Pareek (Project Officer), Nimisha Gaur (Project Officer) from CUTS attended the programme.



After the welcome speech, an overview to organic farming was provided by Deepak Saxena, Assistant Director and Deputy Head (CUTS CART) through his presentation. This highlighted introducing the organic scheme initiated in October 2013 in six districts of Rajasthan. Responded to a query as to how CUTS got involved with Pro-Organic he mentioned as CUTS is aware for the safety and protection of the consumers and has been working for this since a long period.

Technical Session

Following Deepak Saxena's presentation, Dr B D Yadav, Professor, Horticulture, threw light on the need of organic farming in contemporary times, In his presentation, he highlighted the negative impacts of the chemicals that are used in farming in modern times, soil management, importance and ways to follow them, problems faced in organic farming and how to overcome them.

Further, V S Yadav, Professor and Head, Horticulture Department, Durgapura Agriculture farm, gave a presentation on "Technique of Organic Vegetable production". He focused on the negative impacts of the chemicals being used in vegetables in modern time, He urged the farmers to use vermi-compost as far as possible but in case not possible then dung-compost should be used as green fuel. This green manure is not only cost-effective but also increases organic carbon in the soil.

Dr S Mukherji Professor, Horticulture highlighted that the situation that has been deteriorated because of the excess of the chemicals in Punjab and Haryana to such an extent that a cancer train runs through Bhatinda to Bikaner. In this, the people suffering from cancer caused due to the consumption of farm products produced by using chemical fertilisers and other products travel most frequently.

Exposure Visit (January 06, 2017)

On the following day, nearly 30 women farmers visited at Rajasthan Agriculture Research Institute, Durgapur. The visit was hosted by Dr V S Yadav. He showed the farmers different vegetables like cucumber, peas, broccoli, lettuce etc. that were being grown organically.

Dr Yadav informed the farmers that such vegetables have been produced using vermi-compost, jeevamrit and herbal spray.

Besides, the participants also visited vermin-composting unit, different units of making organic products. And some farmers who already had vermi-compost units or were adopting organic farming asked their queries: Problems faced by them using organic farming techniques and what were the possible remedies for the same. Thereafter, an experience sharing session was conducted, where all farmers shared their experiences, the lessons learnt in past two days, and how will they implement them in their farms. The participants were immensely satisfied and thanked CUTS for organising such useful events.



Key Features of the Activity: At a Glance

- The events helped bringing farmers and institutions on a common platform for better coordination in future, which will ultimately help in reaping good results.
- Healthy debate and discussion over myths about organic culture and financial benefits were held during the discussions.
- The events also enabled participants to know some of the traditional ways of organic farming, such as formation of vermi-wash/ vermi-compost, herbal pesticides/insecticides and treatment of seeds and soil management etc.
- Women participants showed keen interest in these events and were present in good number.
- All the six training workshops and exposure visits proved extremely successful in terms of geographical coverage of participation, gender involvement, media coverage, overall conduction of the events etc. Moreover, majority of participating farmers expressed their willingness to switch over to organic farming from their current mode of chemical farming.

- At many places, even those farmers, who were already involved in organic farming came to know about many new and traditional ways of farming helpful in organic culture. They accepted that such trainings are the first of their kind besides what KVKs have been doing for them.
- Feedback forms indicate that over 80 percent of farmers were inspired by the events organised by CUTS and showed immense interest to start organic farming. The level of satisfaction among the participants was found to be quite high.
