However, multiplicity of exemptions and export promotion schemes contribute in complicating the documentation and procedures resulting in a major gap between the customs import and export procedures at home and the best international practices.	Implications Complex procedures not only increase the paper work but also create more hurdles for small exporters. It may increase the legal expenses of exporters and importers, which our small exporters and importers can hardly afford. In the era of stiff international competition, this act as a major disadvantage for our exporters and importers, as it unnecessarily increases the price of exportables and importables.	•	The procedures can be simplified through more use of automation and information technology. It is also essential to have better coordination among different government agencies dealing with exports and imports. Modern best practice calls for a system, which ensures self-compliance and maintenance of records (payment of tax, fees etc.) by exporters and
