



Startup 20: Unlocking Drivers of Growth

The highly anticipated inception meeting of Startup 20, concluded with resounding success in Hyderabad on January 29, 2023. Representatives of multiple countries graced the occasion and enjoyed a rich exchange of ideas to be pursued by Startup 20 over the year. Key personalities associated with Startup 20 introduced the participants to the engagement group’s agenda, priority areas and planned course of action.

A new engagement group created under the Indian G20 presidency, Startup 20 seeks to bring together startups, corporates, investors, innovation agencies in the realm of start-ups, on a common platform and help shape the G20 agenda. The engagement group comprises three task forces, namely Foundation & Alliance, Finance, and Inclusion & Sustainability, where delegates will come together to discuss efficient policy frameworks to promote scaling up of startups in the G20 nations.

India, home to the world’s third highest number of start-ups has seen this space grow by leaps and bounds since 2015. Over 84,000 start-ups today dot the country’s landscape, straddling over 656 districts, reflecting the expanse of penetration. India’s startup story has seen innovators come up with solutions beyond the urban landscape, embedding local specifications in their ventures. G20 presents an opportunity to demonstrate thousands of startup stories before the world, at large. It will also give Indian start-ups an opportunity to identify sectoral opportunities for collaboration in G20 member countries.

As the world shrugs off the turbulence of the economic crises of the post COVID era, start-ups could turn out to be key drivers of growth and innovation. Startup 20 - a unique creation of India's G20 Presidency could be an important step towards institutionalising global cooperation in the sector.
