## **Ending the Logiam over WTO's Appellate Body**

The Appellate Body (AB) of the WTO has stopped hearing appeals since 2019, when the U.S. blocked appointment of members. The AB, set up in 1995, is a standing committee of seven members that presides over appeals against judgments passed in trade-related disputes brought by WTO members.

Despite repeated calls to resolve the logjam resulting from its non-functioning, little progress seems to have been made. During the 12<sup>th</sup> WTO Ministerial Conference (MC12), members committed to resuming discussions with a view to have a fully functional two-tiered dispute settlement system, by 2024. The outcome document of another meeting of trade ministers in September, 2022 in Bali, too, acknowledged the urgency to address concerns resulting from the AB paralysis. It is critical to note that the U.S. is due to have presidential polls in 2024 and therefore, a failure to resolve the issue by then could lead to inordinate delays thereafter.

India has stated that it will also take up the issue of WTO dispute settlement reform, during its G20 Presidency, this year. The G20's Trade and Investment Working Group, under India's presidency has identified WTO reform as one of the five priority areas. As concerns around the need to reform the multilateral trade dispute settlement architecture and revive the AB strike a chord with most countries, it must be pursued as a priority agenda.
