India's Steel Trade Deficit Widens

India's steel trade deficit, the difference between imports and exports, has widened to ₹4,284 crore in the first two months (April and May), approximately 47 per cent of the ₹9,036 crore recorded in FY24, as the country continues to be a net importer of the metal, with a consistent increase in shipments from China.



PM Gati Shakti to Drive Infrastructure Development in India



Morgan Stanley has estimated that growth in infrastructure investments will help fill up the gap in the space, with the help of the PM Gati Shakti National Master Plan. Historically, India's manufacturing competitiveness has suffered due to poor infrastructure conditions.

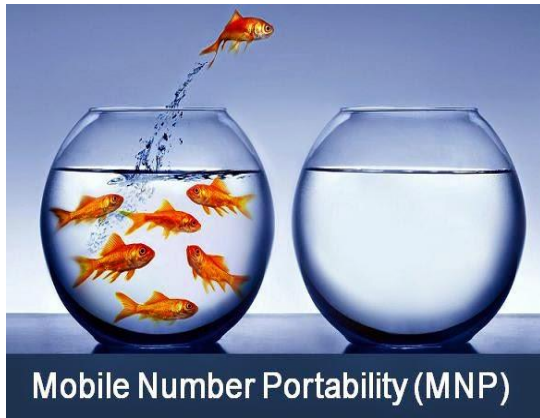


'One Vehicle One Fastag' Norm Kicks Off

"One Vehicle, One FASTag" rule is being enforced across India. This regulation mandates that each vehicle can only be linked to a single FASTag, prohibiting the use of multiple FASTags for a single vehicle. The initiative aims to streamline the electronic toll collection system, enhance efficiency, and ensure the seamless movement of vehicles at toll plazas.



New Mobile Number Portability Rules on the Anvil



In a significant move aimed at enhancing telecom security, the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India has announced amendments to the Mobile Number Portability regulations. Effective July 01, 2024, the new rules mandate a seven-day waiting period for issuing Unique Porting Codes. These rules are aimed at curbing the porting of mobile numbers by way of fraudulent SIM swap/replacement by unscrupulous elements.
